## MathFest 210 Jeopardy Omni William Penn Hotel, Pittsburgh, PA August 4, 2010

The four teams that competed in MathFest 2010 Jeopardy were Augsburg College (Minneapolis MN), Lafayette College (Easton, PA), Hope College (Holland, MI) and Williams College SMALL Project (Williamstown, MA). The team memberships were:

Lafayette College was a last minute substitute for the Denison University team that could not make it to the contest. The Lafayette team dominated the round but Hope College did make a late run in the Linear Algebra category prior to the Final Jeopardy question. The scores prior to Final Jeopardy were Lafayette (5900), Hope (3900), Augsburg (600), and SMALL (-800). The Final Jeopardy question was answered correctly by Lafayette and SMALL. With wagers of 1999 by Lafayette and 2699 by Hope, the team from Lafayette took first place with 7899 total points and Hope took second place with 1201 points. Augsburg finished in third place with 100 points and SMALL finish in fourth place.
